MCYC's goal is to act as a political voice for young people to the Marin County Board of Supervisors and other policy makers. The group conducts research throughout the county to determine how best to make an impact and has worked to improve youth services, tackle educational equity issues, improve transportation options, raise awareness around environmental and health issues, coordinate student-run elections, and raise awareness about underage drinking.
